Our 2nd quarter Melody is NAMI (National Alliance on Mental Illness). Did vou know 1 in 5 adults in America suffer some form of Mental Illness? And across the population 1 in 20 adults are living with a serious mental health condition such as schizophrenia, bipolar disorder or long-term recurring major depression.

As with other serious illnesses, mental illness is not your fault or that of the people around you, but widespread misunderstandings about mental illness remain. Many people don't seek treatment or remain unaware that their symptoms could be connected to a mental health condition. People may expect a person with serious mental illness to look visibly different from others, and they may tell someone who doesn't "look ill" to "get over it" through willpower. These misperceptions add to the challenges of living with a mental health condition

Every year people overcome the challenges of mental illness to do the things they enjoy. Through developing and following a treatment plan, you can dramatically reduce many of your symptoms. People with mental health conditions can and do pursue higher education, succeed in their careers, make friends and have relationships. Mental illness can slow us down, but we don't need to let it stop us.

NAMI has chapters around the United States to help those in need. We have a chapter in Kenosha as well. NAMI helps all ages and all those who are affected by mental illness including those who are care givers. On March 23, 1869 a group of eight intrepid women founded the Woman's Foreign Missionary Society, an organization that is the foundation of the United Women In Faith. Today there are approximately 800,000 members in this organization.

The Purpose of the United Women In Faith is to know God and to experience freedom as whole persons through Jesus Christ; to develop a creative, supportive fellowship; and to expand concepts of mission through participation in the global ministries of the church.

United women in Faith seek to connect and nurture women through Christian spiritual formation, leadership development, creative fellowship and education so that they can inspire, influence and impact local and global communities.

Our Logo aligns with the goals of the United Women In Faith to remain modern, inclusive and relevant. We are a Sisterhood connecting together as community leaders, justice champions, and brave changemakers, we are women with more than a cause. We are on a mission to boldly act and transform communities.

We can accomplish these goals by being part of a UWF Circle offering opportunities for women to study the Bible, pray together and discuss their faith It is a place where women can share their experiences, challenges and successes with each other. It also provides opportunities to develop leadership skills by taking on roles in planning and running circle meetings and activities. UWF Circles often focus on service projects, both within their own communities and around the world. This can help women to connect with others, make a difference in the world and feel a sense of purpose. Some of our projects in 2023 consisted of having a bake sale "Mini Loaves for Many Missions" raising \$277. The purpose was hopefully to bring awareness to the many missions helped by United Women in Faith. We also contributed to Wesley Curtis Strange Christmas Project purchasing all the perishable items for the 8 families which consisted of each family receiving a Christmas Ham, lunch meat, cheese, chicken nuggets, waffles, potatoes, bread, fresh fruit, as well as the non-perishable items collected by our generous members of Wesley. We also gave a generous donation for the local "Room at the Inn" project spearheaded by Marietta Huff of Immanuel Methodist Church to shelter and feed the homeless during the Christmas holiday. Now what?

There's still several weeks until Pentecost, so the apostles will have to spend the next few weeks trying to get ready for the ascension and the coming of the Holy Spirit. This was essential for God's plan, and maybe sometimes we forget this. Since we rightly place most of our attention on Jesus in the Gospels, we can overlook the essential role of those who followed him. The time of Jesus' earthly ministry was spent in trying to convince humanity of His divine nature, and to accept the grace that God offers to us all. If Jesus were to have stayed with us instead of dying and rising, he'd not have needed the apostles. If God hadn't endowed us with Free Will, we'd never have turned from Him in the first place. As it is, though. God did what He chose to do. Jesus did His part, and now it is time for humanity to do theirs.

Today we live in a country where religious observance is a minority activity. Many churches are experiencing falling congregations, and those who make up those congregations are growing older and are not being replaced with younger members. The population of this country is growing, but churches are closing. Unless we can reverse this trend, we may reach a situation when the faith will simply die out.

Erasmus, the famous Renaissance scholar, once told a classic story which was designed to emphasize how important it is that we take up the torch of Christ's ministry with great commitment. In the story, Jesus returns to heaven after his time on earth. The angels gather around him to learn all that happened during his days on earth. Jesus tells them of the miracles, his teachings, his death on the cross, and his resurrection.

When he finishes his story, Michael the Archangel asks Jesus, "But what happens now?" Jesus answers, "I have left behind eleven faithful disciples and a handful of men and women who have faithfully followed me. They will declare my message and express my love. These faithful people will build my church." "But," responds Michael, "

What if these people fail? What then is your other plan?" And Jesus answers, "I have no other plan!"

As the body of Christ we, like the apostles, are charged with the duty of preaching the Gospel. It is up to us to bring to today's world this wonderful, glorious Gospel of love, salvation and redemption that has sustained and comforted people for 2000 years. Jesus is counting on you and me.

Jesus did not tell his disciples that they would not have problems. In fact, their problems would dwarf most of our problems. What he did promise them was peace of mind. He would send upon them the gift of the Holy Spirit to give them courage and comfort. They would be warriors and not worriers. And that is the same promise Christ offers us today. As we, like the apostles wait for Pentecost and the coming of the Holy Spirit, let us make ready for our role in God's plan.
